On 14 April 2021 Council held the most successful Youth Week event to date, with approximately 50 youth from across the shire celebrating at Stan Peters Oval in Hillston which was transformed into a laser tag course, pound fit and t-shirt painting areas, courtesy of funding from Murrumbidgee Primary Health Network – Empowering our Communities Program.

Council took the opportunity to combine the Youth Week event with the official opening of the Stan Peters Oval Improvements which includes a new perimeter white picket fence, new goal posts, additional oval seating and a state of the art LED electronic scoreboard which was made possible by \$197,000 funding from the NSW Government's Stronger Country Communities Fund, the opening was officiated by Mayor Darryl Jardine.

PUBLIC EXHIBITION Draft Hillston Flood Study

Under the NSW Governments Flood Prone Land Policy, Councils are responsible for managing flood affected areas to help reduce risk to people and property. Carrathool Shire Council has been developing a Floodplain Risk Management Plan for Hillston with the aim of better understanding and managing the flood risks within the town. The project has progressed to the completion of a Draft Flood Study, which includes the development and calibration of modelling tools to determine the existing flood risk and test any potential future mitigation works.

The draft Flood Study is being prepared by Catchment Simulation Solutions and is jointly funded by Council and the NSW Government. Council is exhibiting the draft Flood Study to the community for comment.

The community is invited to provide comment on the Flood Study either by email or phone to tim.morrison@csse.com.au (02) 8355 5500.

Public information sessions will also be held on Tuesday 4 May between 8:30am and 10:30am and 3pm and 5pm at the Hillston District Office, 139-145 High St, community members are invited to attend drop in and discuss the study with Tim Morrison from Catchment Simulation Solutions, submissions will also be taken at the public information sessions.

Submissions will be received by Council until 4:15pm Tuesday 25 May, 2021.

THE SPRINGS ROAD PAVE AND SEAL

Council are currently undertaking a 1.5km section of road construction on the Springs Road between the Back Hillston Road and Malley Downs Road. Work is expected to take approximately six (6) weeks weather depending.

Museum of Applied Arts and Sciences is touring the exhibition across the South West region of NSW from March until May 2021.


