During 2020 Marie has taken authorities to task with an aim to improve counselling services for residents in the shire.

In August 2020 Marie organised a very successful community meeting that was focused around the needs of the community and lack of mental health services in regional areas. Since then she has gained the support of the wider community, Council, Counselling Services in Griffith and our local member Helen Dalton MP, who took Marie's fight to the State Government by mentioning in Parliament the lack of services available regionally and the work Marie was doing within our community.

The community also benefitted from the Mindset tour in November, another community event where the community could come together and discuss mental health.

To top it off Marie is always one of the first to offer help with participation in fundraisers and community events.





## 2020 YOUNG CITIZEN OF THE YEAR (13-25 YEARS) KHLOE FAVERO

During 2020 Khloe was an active student of the Murrumbidgee Regional High School, she was responsible for the 2020 installation of the "Blue Poles" project at the ag farm. The "Blue Poles" project was commenced on RUOK Day in September 2020, where over 20 poles located in the school's paddock were painted blue, the aim of the "Blue Poles" is to raise awareness of mental health issues for students and teachers alike.

Khloe also assisted local member Helen Dalton MP regarding mental health in regional areas as well as indigenous youth issues within her school.



#### 2020 SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR ~ CLAUDIA TAYLOR

Claudia is a committed triathlete who in 2020 gained great success. Not only was Claudia the 1<sup>st</sup> overall female sprint winner at the Hillston Outback Triathlon she also participated in the Riverina Triathlon series where she placed first overall female in 5 of the 6 events held across the region. Claudia narrowly missed out on taking out the final series by only a few points.

Claudia is a member of the Hillston Outback Triathlon committee and is involved in the organisation and running of the annual event.

Claudia also volunteers her time as a coach for the Hillston Swimming Club and participated in Griffith's Half on the Hill, a 21km run, where she placed in the top 3 overall women.

## 2020 JUNIOR SPORTSPERSON OF THE YEAR (12-18 YEARS) UKAIPO MANN

In 2020, Ukaipo represented Hillston Central School at both Zone and Riverina carnivals, swimming in individual and team events and was selected to participate in the RAP Open Tennis and cricket teams.

Ukaipo was the age champion for the school cross country, swimming and athletics. She was also awarded Hillston Central School's Senior Girls Sports Champion.

In the 2020 Hillston Outback Triathlon mini event, Ukaipo was placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall female competitor.

In 2020, Ebony represented Hillston Central School at both Zone and Regional swimming carnivals where she qualified for the PSSA State Swimming in 50m freestyle.

Ebony also competed in the 2020 Hillston Outback Triathlon and during 2020 she travelled around the region competing in other community triathlons.

#### WATER AND SEWER NEWS

Council's Water and Sewer Department have been busy around the shire during January, with:

- construction of water mains on High Street Hillston between McGee and Haines Streets is in progress and is expected to be completed early February.
- relocation and replacement of 800 meters of water mains from the Langtree bore site.
- commissioning of the Automated Meter Read (AMR) System for the Melbergen water scheme to help to identify any issues with meters and water losses. The Yoolaroi scheme is soon to be completed with future planning and extension of work for the Goolgowi water scheme.

Residents are reminded to be vigilant of plant and equipment on-site and follow traffic and safety signs at all times.

Council would like to notify residents that water meter readings are being conducted between:

Please ensure that all gates are unlocked, dogs are restrained and water meters are visible and clear of any overgrown vegetation during this period. If Council officers are unable to read your meter due to these issues, your account will be issued with an estimated reading.
