3. Roads to Recovery (R2R) – 2023-2024 Projects

Purpose: To provide information regarding the new funding for R2R - Projects

2023/2024 is the final year of the 2019-2024 five-year program. Council was allocated \$10,196,977.00. Council spent the money in each year as shown below:

Anticipated Balance

Council anticipates completion of the 2022/23 program this year, should this not be able to happen the allocated projects will be rolled into the 2023/24 financial year.

To date expenditure on R2R this financial year is \$967,030. The bulk of the remaining funding is allocated towards resealing works anticipated to be completed by the sealing contractor prior to June 2023.

It is recommended Council allocate the balance of the R2R for re-sheeting and grading works on Pinteebakana Road North.

Proposed Project: Pinteebakana Road (North) (Grading and re-sheeting) \$77,349.

Recommendation:

That the Roads Committee:

- 1. nominate Pinteebakana Road (North) to be resheeted under the R2R program to expenditure of \$77,349.
- 2. Note that 2023/2024 is the final year of the current R2R funding program.

Attachment: Regional Roads Maintenance Budget Breakdown

Each year Council is funded by the NSW state government for the maintenance and upkeep of the regional roads within the Local Government Area. The funding must be spent on regional roads and any unspent funding returned to the state government following the end of the financial year.

Council has the following roads classified as Regional Roads:

The following projects are proposed:

5. Local Roads Capital

Purpose: To provide information regarding Local Road capital projects

Proposed Projects for Local Roads Capital

As raised with Council informally at the March 2023 meeting it is not recommended Council schedule any capital works for the 2023/24 financial year given the extraordinary amount of funded works to be completed this financial year.

Regional and Local Roads Repair Program \$4,760,000

The objective of this program is to assist Councils with urgent road repairs, priority corrective maintenance and immediate repair of potholes across the road network. This funding will allow Council to repair and maintain roads but will not allow upgrading past the original road structure.

Fixing Local Roads \$834,250

Currently Council has been granted funding towards roadworks under this program that are to be completed by February 2025. Apart from the immediate job at Boorga Road as resolved by Council at the February meeting many of these works can be scheduled towards the second half of the 2023/24 financial year or in the first half of 2024/25 depending on resourcing and progress with the more urgent timeframes of other funding provided.

Remote Roads Pilot Program \$1,170,000

While the job will be put to tender in accordance with Council resolution, it is included in the document to provide Council with details of funding. Grant funds are \$936,000 and Council contribution is \$234,000 from reserve funds for a total cost of \$1,170,000. The timeframe for completion in accordance with funding grants is 30/06/2024

Flood Works Restoration

At the time of preparing this document the amount of approved funding is unknown, however it would be prudent of Council to utilise other grant sources if possible depending upon the amount of damage done to individual roads and their treatment options.

Pothole Repair Program \$896,465

Council has undertaken works within the program and at the time of preparing the report has expended approximately \$200,000 of the funding. The remainder approximately \$700,000 needs to be expended by 30 December 2023. This will need to be a priority for the first half of the next financial year.

Fixing Country Roads / Fixing Local Roads

Council was unsuccessful in gaining funding under the Fixing Country Roads during the 2022/23 financial year. It is unknown if either of these programs will be available during the 2023/24 financial year.

However, should they become available Council has previously nominated under Fixing Country Roads:

- 1. The Springs Road
- 2. Booligal Road
- 3. Mossgiel Road

Should the above program crystallise Council would be able to nominate the above and offer as a contribution the funds set aside under the Regional Roads Block grant program for capital works on the following roads:

The Springs Road \$534,000
 Booligal Road \$500,000

Should an opportunity become available under Fixing Local Roads Council has the following road programs costed – these were not granted funding under the last round of Fixing Local Roads. It is suggested that Council contribute \$100,000 towards each project should an opportunity arise.

6. Local Roads Maintenance

Purpose: To provide information regarding local roads.

It is estimated Council should receive approximately \$2,700,000 under the roads component of the Financial Assistance Grant. Council has always balanced local road expenditure against this income. It is recommended to Council that it transfer \$2,000,000 to reserve funds leaving \$700,000 for maintenance should it be required. As previously stated there is multiple sources of funding to undertake maintenance activity. If needed staff can report to Council should additional maintenance funds be required and Council should regularly review the various programs to monitor progress and expenditure.

Recommendation:

That the Roads Committee:

- 1. note and approve the Local Roads Maintenance program for 2023-2024.
- 2. transfer \$2,000,000 from the roads component of the Financial Assistance Grant for 2023-2024 to Local Roads Reserve Fund for future use on Council roads.
